family tradition that Thomas Moffitt, who was a surveyor in Cecil County,

Thomas also, in 1803, drafted release papers to free Violet, a black slave
when she reached the age of 26 yrs. She was 12 at the time. She died at the
age of 86, and is supposed to be buried behind him in the Old Stone
Graveyard. This information was related, along with a copy of the release
document in May 2004.
